Support on offer through Lamlash Primary and Arran High School's Wellbeing Centre

Do you know that through our wellbeing centre we offer the following free (confidential) support for children and families?

- Counselling (age 10 and above).
- Family therapy (all families).
- Nurture type activities that support emotional wellbeing for primary 1 upwards.
- English as an Additional Language support.
- Referral to CAMHS for mental health and diagnostic services.
- Referral to Penumbra for support for self-harm.
- School nurse (Ann Reid) general health and wellbeing support.
- Referral and support from the Educational Psychologist.
- Support from Colin McDermott for school inclusion (if school is proving generally tough regardless of the reason he can provide additional support).
- Art therapy and play therapy (age 10 upwards).
- Specialist counselling to support understanding of a special need or disability (age 10 upwards).
- Referral to speech and language.
- Bereavement counselling.

Family therapy you can contact direct without going through the school and it remains confidential, all we will know is that an anonymous family has used the service. I have included the leaflet at the end of the newsletter.

For other support systems please contact me (Mrs Dick) at the school to discuss what support you think your child might benefit from, if any. When we put the systems in place last year we designed it so that our community partners (school nurse, social services, GPs) can also refer into the services, though the quickest way remains through us directly. If you have any questions on this please be in contact.

Talking relationships

Over the past few months I have been carrying out research with the University of the West of Scotland on teacher identity, with teachers across the Highlands and Islands (Arran excepted). Quite simply, what is it that makes a teacher feel at the end of the school year that they have done a good job? I freely admit I went into the research expecting the teacher to talk about progress, how well a child had done in literacy and numeracy etc. Now, those were mentioned but what every single teacher I interviewed said was they would know they had been good at their job that year if they had had successful relationships with the children and their families. They wanted their pupils to feel positive about coming to their classroom (as distinct from liking school or not), and to be able to work together in their journey that year.

For us here in Lamlash it is about us having a nurturing ethos where we want every child to feel nurtured and welcomed, regardless of where they stand academically; that there is something that will bring them to school each day and that they are welcome here for who they are. This is reflected in our merit certificates and award initiatives where merits are not given for achieving academically but for striving to be a good learner and so they know it is noticed.

Last week while reviewing our recognition system across the campus I became aware that there was nothing for staff for them to know when they have done a good job. So we have decided to launch Staff Stars. By clicking on the link below (anonymously if you wish) you can provide a bit of positive feedback for a member of staff who you have felt has gone above and beyond to support your child or the school. It has been a tumultuous year for all and just sometimes it is nice to hear when things have gone well. We are all a little guilty of assuming people know we are appreciative.
