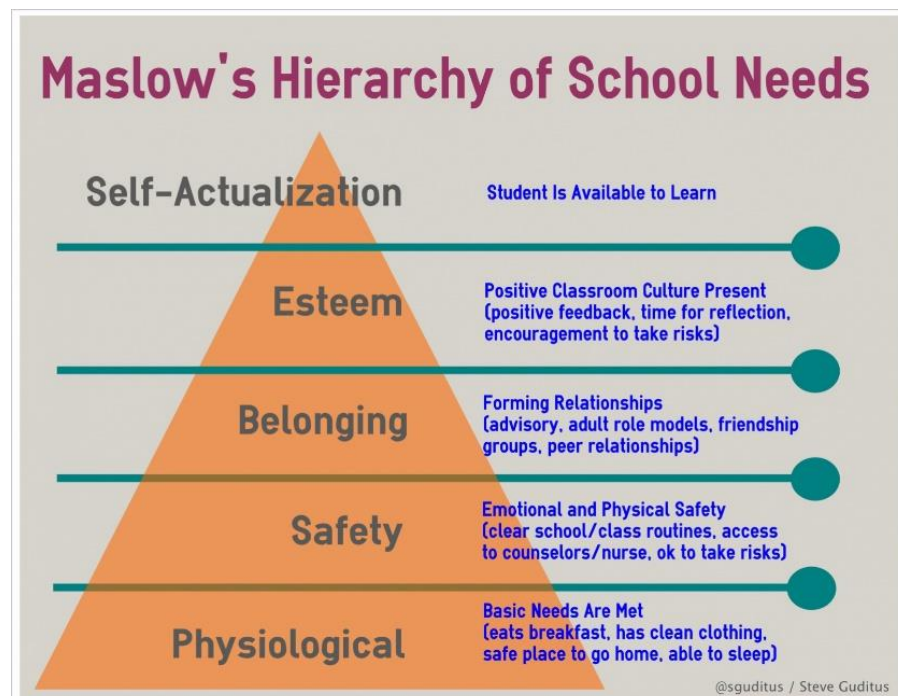
Donations towards the hampers will be gratefully received at the primary school or early years class.

## NEWS FROM MRS DICK

My job in the school focuses on everything pastoral i.e. the health and wellbeing of our young people and their families and looking how we can provide support through the school so they are at a point where they are ready to learn. When talking about this with others I often refer to Maslow's hierarchy of needs. This is the hierarchy:



Very simply, for a child to be able to learn effectively at school, basic and psychological needs need to be met in the first instance. Have they had breakfast, have they got somewhere to live? Do they need support to feel loved and be secure? Our role in the school is not to judge who has these or who doesn't but to provide the additional support and resources to help our children and their families have what they need to be on an equal footing when it comes to successfully accessing education as anyone else and there can be many reasons for this including additional support needs, loss of income at home, historical reasons which no-one is to 'blame' for. What a child's needs looks like in a school setting is this:
